Upper School Profile

Antilles School is a Pre-K to 12th college preparatory school on St. Thomas in the US Virgin Islands. We serve a diverse community of learners and inspire individual excellence in a collaborative setting, while empowering each student with the academic and life skills needed to become engaged, intentional citizens able to transition from our small island to anywhere in the world.

At Antilles, students from nearly every cultural and economic background call our campus home. Along with providing a rigorous curriculum that prepares students for acceptance to the nation's top universities, we also help shape their physical, emotional, and intellectual well-being. All courses are focused on core college preparatory material and skills but also allow students to engage at an age-appropriate pace, and in a greater depth. Small class sizes provide an individual student-teacher connection, while also enhancing student interaction. We challenge our learners to collaborate, to lead, to share decision making, and to be mindful of the environment around them.

Upper School offers a unique opportunity for career exploration as both seniors and juniors complete two-week spring internships. Through Junior Internship, students gain valuable on-the-job experience working alongside professionals in various career settings. Senior Project is either an internship which focuses on the student's intended field of study in college or a passion project (such as painting a large-scale mural or coding a web page).

Our school is situated on 27 acres on St. Thomas' south side, and our modern facilities include a theater, libraries, gymnasium, and laboratories which offer our students the time for deeper learning and provide a competitive edge upon acceptance to four-year colleges and universities. With close proximity to beaches, nature preserves, and historical landmarks, students are able to take advantage of off-campus learning opportunities under the water, in lush tropical forests, up mountain peaks, and across rich agricultural farm grounds.

GPA CALCULATION

GPA is weighted for Honors (+.33 pts) and AP (+.33 pts) courses. Beginning in grade 9, all subjects are included in the computation. A minimum of 24 credits and 100 hours of Community Service are required for graduation.
